Maths targets Please encourage your child to:


To count to 20 and beyond, to count in 2's and 10's and

- * To recognise and write numbers to 20, correctly formed
- * To begin to recognise coins and to count ON when
- * To be able to add and take away two numbers using objects, a number line or by counting on or back to find the answer.
- * To encourage your child to know all the different ways

for example for number bonds to 10 (1 + 9 = 10, 2 + 8 = 10, 3 + 7 = 10, 4 + 6 = 10, 5 + 5 = 10.

- * To encourage your child to show you how to make a number in different ways using fingers for example 'show me 4 fingers.... now show me in a different way, grouping 5 sweets in different ways).
- * To recognise a small set of items (up to 6) without
- * To use everyday language to talk about size, weight, capacity, position, distance, time and money to compare

How can you help your child:

Please encourage your child to;

- * to have good hygiene rules- wash hands for 20 seconds, cough or sneeze into a tissue or into their elbow.
- * Please encourage your child to talk about similarities and differences in the environment.
- * Please hear your child read every day, it doesn't have to be their school reading book. You could encourage your child to find tricky words in their bedtime story book or help you read a small word like c-a-t. d-u-ck
 - * Please encourage your child to practise their spellings every day at home.
 - * Please encourage your child to ask you questions and explain why things happen.
 - * Please encourage your child to get dressed on their own.
 - * Please send your child to school with a pair of Wellington boots for Forest school days.
 - * Please make sure your child has their PE kit in school.

- *Please remember to name all of your child's belongings including their jumpers, cardigans, coats and hats.
- *Please be aware that outdoor play is a very important part of the curriculum, and we aim to go outside every day. Please ensure your child is dressed appropriately with sensible shoes and a sun hat. Please also apply sun cream when you know the weather will be warmer.
